- Jatin Das was born on the 2nd of December 1941 in Mayurbhanj in Odisha, India. A contemporary artist living in Delhi, he has been painting for 60 years.
- He paints with oil, acrylic, watercolour, ink and Conté.
- As a printmaker, he has produced many editions of etchings, dry point, lithograph, serigraphs.
- He has held over 68 one-man exhibitions both in India and abroad, participated in numerous national and international shows and artist camps.
- In 2012, he was conferred the Padma Bhushan award, India's highest civilian award, by the President of India.
- His works are part of several public and private collections in India and abroad.
- Most notably, he created a 7 x 68 ft mural at the Parliament of India, titled 'Mohenjo-Daro to Mahatma Gandhi', inaugurated by then Prime Minister, Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee.
- Das has lectured extensively at innumerable art and architectural colleges and museums on contemporary and traditional art forms, in India and abroad.
- He has been an advisor to many governments and private art and cultural bodies.
- In addition to charitable donations locally and internationally, Jatin Das actively led the relief and rehabilitation work of a village in Orissa after the super cyclone of 1999.
- Das studied at the Sir JJ School of Art, Bombay.

During the last 60 years, Jatin Das has built a large personal collection of traditional arts, including a rare collection of more than 6,500 hand fans. He has established the JD Centre of Art (JDCA) in Odisha to preserve and promote art in all its forms and to house his collection of traditional and modern art. JDCA was registered as a Trust in 1997, with Das as its Founder and Chairman. It is under construction, designed by the eminent architect, B. V. Doshi.

• Fifty years ago, Jatin Das began a collection of *pankha* (hand fans). It includes more than 6500 fans and related objects, a majority of which are from the Indian subcontinent. The collection has been on display at eminent museums in India and overseas. The inaugural show at the National Crafts Museum, Delhi, was followed by exhibitions at the Victoria Memorial, Kolkata; Fan Museum, London; Rietberg Museum, Zurich; National Art Gallery, Kuala Lumpur; National Museum, Manila; and the Kennedy Centre, Washington DC, USA. The collection is poised to be donated to the proposed National Pankha Museum, New Delhi. A book on the subject, 'To Stir the Still Air', will be published.
